

# **UNCOMPENSATED CARE**

Last year, CHOC provided more than \$149 million in care to treat our patients, regardless of their families' ability to pay.



### **ONCOLOGY**

- Accommodated an additional 300 patient visits, five stem cell transplants and 25 clinical studies compared to the previous year.
- Pioneered new treatment options for leukemia, lymphoma and sarcomas.
- Recognized as a Best Children's Hospital by *U.S. News and World Report*'s 2022-23 rankings and a Designated Comprehensive Cancer Center by the National Cancer Institute.



## **SOCIAL SERVICES**

- Gifted gas cards, taxi rides and bus passes to 870 families for transit to and from CHOC.
- · Delivered food vouchers and grocery cards to 750 families in financial hardship.
- Assisted in mortuary expenses for 81 families who have lost a child.
- Offered 59 families financial assistance toward essential medications.



### CHILD LIFE

- Hired a full-time art therapist to provide creative, expressive activities for children.
- · Hosted a graduation for 22 patients graduating from middle/high school or college.
- · Welcomed Odessa, the second dog in our Resident Dog and Pet Therapy Program.
- Awarded \$17,735 in educational scholarships to patients and close relatives in The Richard C. and Virginia A. Hunsaker Adolescent and Young Adult Oncology Child Life Program (AYA).



#### MENTAL HEALTH

- Launched a coping group for teens with chronic illness, depression and anxiety.
- · Attained an 87% Intensive Outpatient Center graduation rate—very high for this population.
- Integrated psychology services into our Primary Care Network, treating over 1,100 families.
- Partnered with area schools to provide trauma-informed training to 11,000 participants.
